

Each community water solution we fund is part of a larger overall program that focuses on long term sustainable development.



Our project types in the southeastern region of Kenya include constructing sand dams, adjacent wells critical to water access, and rainwater harvesting systems at local schools that provide water coverage for children and family members both at home and at school. Dovetailed with these water-focused projects is education to help these largely agricultural communities leverage their new water resources effectively for their region of Kenya. This education includes instruction in climate-smart agriculture, drought-tolerant seed distribution and loaning of tools, and hygiene and sanitation education.

was established in 2001 as a registered US charitable organization and was inspired by family members of Lifepus founders who were battling cancer at that time.



For the first 10 years, we focused primarily on funding research initiatives that developed innovative cancer treatments. We also provided funding for the care of children at St. Jude's Research Hospital in Memphis, Tennessee as well as various hunger and disaster relief efforts.

In 2012, we began funding projects that improve communities in need through clean local water, food security, and education. We believe that every person deserves the dignity of having access to basic human needs and the opportunity to live a full life.

In recent years, we have focused on water initiatives because clean water impacts all of the pillars of the Lifepus Foundation; reliable food sources, greater access to education and better overall health.
